Section of Lyn Stacie Getz Playground in Bel Air to Close for Renovations

Bel Air, Md., (Feb. 18, 2022) – The Harford County Department of Parks and Recreation will close a portion of the Lyn Stacie Getz playground in Bel Air for approximately six weeks beginning on or about March 1 while it undergoes renovations.

The project involves removing the old pressure treated wooden playground in the section for 2- to 5-year-olds and installing a new custom creative playground for the same age group. The rest of the playground will remain open for use by the public.

The new equipment will include a clubhouse, racing slides, a rock wall, a net bridge and suspension bridge, a tunnel, rainbow steps, different types of swings and sensory panel maze, among other items.

This is the first significant renovation to the playground off the intersection of Route 24 and West Ring Factory Road since it was built in 2001. The county worked on the project with members of the Getz family, who helped fund the original playground.

Some of the memorials will be temporarily removed to be kept safe during construction; they will be returned to their existing locations when the project is complete.
