

Tax & spend legislation vetoed

For 50 years, the Harford County Council has acted as a check on government spending through their authority to cut line items from the budget. Now a majority of the council is pushing to increase spending too. The result in other Maryland counties where the legislative branch has this authority has been higher taxes. Therefore, I have vetoed [Bill 24-016](#), and I would like to thank Council members Guthrie, Giangiordano, and Reilly, who voted against the bill. [You can read my veto message here](#).

Household hazardous waste collection Aug. 6

Harford County residents can drop off household hazardous waste for free on Tuesday, August 6 from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. at the Harford Mulch & Compost Facility. Household hazardous waste is any leftover material that is corrosive, toxic, ignitable, or reactive. Examples include oil-based paints, solvents, pesticides, herbicides, drain cleaners, and pool chemicals. Visit the county website for a [complete list of acceptable items](#). Please note, this event is for residents only, no commercial businesses are allowed. The facility is located at 3139 Scarboro Road in Street.
