

What to do if you smell gas

You may have heard about the explosion following a reported gas leak that destroyed homes in Abingdon last month. If you smell gas, inside or outside, leave the area immediately and call 9-1-1. Do not turn anything on or off that could cause a spark. The 9-1-1 call-taker will ask you questions while dispatching the fire department.

Firefighters will try to find the source of the reported leak, using meters to detect dangerous substances in the air. If they are detected, firefighters will call for more help. The fire department may ask the 9-1-1 center to notify the appropriate utility to also respond. So if you smell gas, remember to call 9-1-1 to stay safe.
