Sign up for Harford County emergency alerts

To keep you safe and informed, my administration has upgraded to a faster and more reliable system to send emergency notifications to your phone or inbox. The new system, HarfordCoMD Alerts, will send real-time notifications about severe weather, infrastructure outages, major traffic disruptions, evacuations/shelter-in-place orders and more. You can also register to receive non-emergency information about hydrant flushing, street sweeping, and other public events. If you were receiving emergency alerts under our old system, your phone number has already been transferred to the new one, but it's still a good idea to register to make sure your email address and other critical information are accurate. [Registration is quick, easy and free.](#)



How can we help you? We have an app for that!

The fastest way to reach us is through our [You CLICK We FIX app](#), where you can report quality-of-life concerns, like potholes, trash dumping, and overgrown vegetation, from your smartphone. Simply snap a photo of the problem, send it to us through the app, and you'll hear back from us within 24 hours. The free app also lets you monitor the status of requests and shows when problems are fixed.

“Level Up” for small businesses

To support Harford’s small businesses, our Department of Economic Development is launching “Level Up,” a year-long series of workshops to help entrepreneurs and business owners start and grow their companies. Topics will vary each month, beginning this month with Doing Business with the Federal Government - A Comprehensive Guide for Contractors on Tuesday, August 26 at 10 a.m. at the CONVERGE Innovation Center in Aberdeen. Veterans Corner - Guard your DD-214

Last week alone, our veterans’ affairs coordinator was contacted by three local families who were struggling to access VA burial benefits because they didn’t have their deceased service member’s DD214. The Certificate of Discharge from Active Duty, or DD-214, summarizes a military service member’s active duty and is required to access many VA benefits.

DD-214 copies and other military service records can be obtained, free of cost, through the [National Archives](#). To safeguard your DD-214, consider recording it with the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Harford County (1-800-989-8296) and make sure your family knows where it’s located.
